Since Friday morning it seems as though there is only one thing that has happened in the world, namely the death of Queen Elizabeth II.

The death of Her Majesty is arguably the most significant thing to have happened in our world in the past 7 decades. Why? Largely because through everything that has happened in our society, through turmoil, drought, flood, sporting success, financial upheaval, technological advances etc. the Head of our Nation, of several other Nations and the Commonwealth of Nations has been there as a calm and peaceful force of goodness and love. Her Majesty's faith in God was something she never made a secret of and here are some quotes about this central part of who she was and how she lived and worked.

Her Majesty credited her personal faith in God and belief in Christ as her anchor amid the many storms, both public and private, that she endured. To the end, she fulfilled her sacred coronation vows to God, living faithfully and serving those entrusted to her care.

In her 2016 Christmas message, Her Majesty explained, "Billions of people now follow Christ's teaching and find in him the guiding light for their lives. I am one of them because Christ's example helps me see the value in doing small things with great love, whoever does them and whatever they themselves believe."

The Queen's love of the Bible and its gospel message led to her participation in the publication of a special book to commemorate her 90th birthday. Titled *The Servant Queen and the King She Serves*, coauthored by Catherine Butcher and Mark Greene, this overview of Her Majesty's Christian faith was published by Bible Society UK, for whom the Queen serves as patron, along with HOPE and the London Institute for Contemporary Christianity.

Her Majesty personally wrote the foreword, thanking readers for their prayers and good wishes. "I have been—and remain—very grateful to ... God for His steadfast love. I have indeed seen His faithfulness," she wrote.
