Sunday 30th October is a 5th Sunday, and as usual, it will be a 'one service in the parish', and we do hope for a full church!

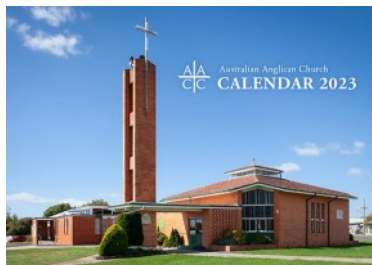
