JANUARY 25 is the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, Apostle. This is the day when we commemorate when our Lord, by the power of his grace, transformed a zealous persecutor into an impassioned apostle. Saul of Tarsus was brought up as a Pharisee and an enemy of Jesus Christ. After the death of St. Stephen, at which Saul was present (Acts 7:58), he participated in a fierce persecution against the Christians. He "began to harass the Church. He entered house after house, dragged men and women out, and threw them into jail" (Acts 8:3). He was then empowered by the Jerusalem Council to go to Damascus to arrest and bring to Jerusalem anyone who lived according to the new way (Acts 9:2). As Saul approached Damascus, it was then that the Lord intervened. By means of a sudden flash of light, Saul was thrown to the ground, and at the same time he heard a voice saying: "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" In response, he asked: "Who are you, Lord?" Then the voice identified itself: "I am Jesus whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:3-6). This was the moment of his conversion, and he who was once a determined persecutor now became a vessel of election.



This feast originated in Gaul in the sixth century and is celebrated on January 25, the presumed date of the transfer of the relics of St. Paul to the Constantinian basilica on the Ostian Way.
