THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT, MARCH 26TH 2023

On Wednesday this week we remember **John Keble**, an English priest whose influence is still felt in the Anglican Church today, and particularly in the way we worship as 'Catholic Anglicans'.

Born in 1792, the son of a priest, John Keble showed early brilliance as a scholar, becoming a fellow of Oriel College, Oxford, at the age of nineteen, a few years before his ordination. He won great praise for his collection of poems, The Christian Year, issued in 1827, and was elected Professor of Poetry in Oxford in 1831. A leader of the Tractarian movement, which protested at the threats to the Church from liberal developments in both politics and theology, he nevertheless did not seek preferment and in 1836 became a parish priest near Winchester, a position he held until his death in 1866. He continued to write scholarly books and was praised for his character and spiritual counsel. Yet he is still best remembered for a sermon he preached in Oxford, considered to be the beginning of the Oxford Movement, delivered on July 14 in 1833.

In 1857 he published two pamphlets against the Divorce Act, as well as a treatise On Eucharistical Adoration, defending the doctrine of the Real Presence from its attack in the G. A. Denison case. In 1863 he issued a Life of T. Wilson, Bishop of Sodor and Man (d. 1755). His later poetry included contributions to the Lyra Apostolica (1836), an English rendering of the Psalter (1839) and Lyra Innocentium (1846).

Meanwhile, since 1836, Keble had been Vicar of Hursley, near Winchester. He was never offered (and never wished for) preferment, remaining at Hursley, a devoted parish priest, for the rest of his life. He died at Bournemouth on 29 Mar. 1866. His beauty of character impressed all who came into contact with him, and his advice on spiritual matters, always given with great diffidence, was widely sought after.

In 1870 Keble College, Oxford, was founded in his memory, with E. S. Talbot as the first warden.

Feast day in some parts of the Anglican Communion, 29 March; 14 July in Common Worship (UK).
