

EASTER WEEK

Last week was Holy Week and each day could have Holy precede it; i.e. Holy Monday, Holy Tuesday etc. The name Good Friday usually displaces Holy Friday. One of the most horrid things that happens now, due largely to ignorance and lack of sensitivity to anything Christian, is that Holy/ Maundy Thursday and Good Friday are now often referred to as Easter Thursday and Easter Friday. This may also be because for so long calendars etc. have referred to Holy Saturday as Easter Saturday.

Today we begin EASTER WEEK and every day can have Easter added to it, up to and including Easter Saturday (this year the 15th April)!

Now some details about the special ceremonies for Pascha/Easter.

Paschal Vigil Service, the principal celebration of Easter, traditionally observed during the night of Holy Saturday/Easter Sunday. In the 2nd century there is clear evidence that there was a single festival celebrating both the Passion and the Resurrection of Christ, and the same situation is probably reflected in various NT passages (e.g. 1 Cor. 5:7 f.). The Peri Pascha of Melito of Sardis supports the suggestion that this unitary feast developed out of a Christianized observance of the Jewish Passover ritual. By the time of Tertullian (d. c. 225) the observance lasted throughout the night and was closely associated with Baptism, an association probably already discernible in Romans chapter6. The elaborate description of the rite of Baptism in Hippolytus' Apostolic Tradition is almost certainly that of a Paschal Vigil Service, in which the Baptism at cockcrow is followed by the Eucharist. In the 4th cent., with the development of the liturgical year and the separate observance of Good Friday, the main emphasis of the Paschal Vigil Service came to centre upon the Resurrection. The Paschal Candle, with its symbolism of light, was introduced in Italy (apart from Rome) about the same time, and later spread to Gaul. In the Western Church the service was put back to the Saturday afternoon in the 10th cent. and to the Saturday morning in the 14th, thereby losing the point of much of its symbolism. Only with the revision of the Holy Week lituray in the RC Church in 1951 was the Pas-

chal Vigil Service restored to the late evening of Holy Saturday.

The Paschal Vigil Service has been subjected to various modifications through the ages, but the basic pattern has remained. According to the present Roman Catholic rite, the celebrant blesses the New Fire outside the church, marks the Paschal Candle with the sign of the Cross, the Greek letters alpha and omega, and the date of the year, and then lights it from the New Fire. (Since 1970 a simpler blessing of the Candle has been permitted.) The deacon (or in the absence od a deacon, the celebrant) carries the lighted Candle through a darkened church, making three stations at which is said or sung 'Light of Christ'; candles held by members of the congregation are lit from the Paschal Candle. When the procession reaches the sanctuary the lights in the church are lit. The deacon then sings the Exultet, after which the people's candles are laid aside. Nine scriptural readings normally follow, interspersed with responsorial Psalms or periods of silence. Of the seven OT readings the first three record the story of creation, Abraham's sacrifice of Isaac, and the crossing of the Red Sea during the Exodus; the other four are prophecies of redemption. (Some may be omitted.)

The New Testament readings are the passage about Christ's resurrection and our Baptism in Romans 6: 3–11, followed by a solemn Alleluia, and one of the Gospel accounts of the Resurrection. A homily is then delivered.

The next part of the service is connected with Baptism and normally takes place round the font, to which a procession is made behind the Paschal Candle. If there is to be a Baptism the baptismal water is then blessed. Baptism is administered to any candidates and if a bishop is present, any newly baptized adults are confirmed. (If there are no candidates for Baptism, it is permitted to use a simple blessing of the water.) All present then renew their baptismal vows in answer to questions put by the celebrant, who sprinkles the people with the newly blessed water.

The service concludes with the remaining parts of the Easter Eucharist, during which the newly baptized make their Communion. A form of Paschal Vigil Service closely modelled on the current RC rite is used in many Anglican Churches.
