Dunstan, St (c. 909–88), Archbishop of Canterbury.

After being attached for some time to the court of King Athelstan, he made his profession as a monk at Glastonbury (where he had earlier received the tonsure) and c. 940 became abbot. He was a strict ascetic who completely reformed the monastery, insisting on the full observance of the Benedictine Rule, and under him the monastery became famous for its learning. He became a royal counsellor under King Eadred (946–55), but during the next reign had to migrate to Flanders. After his recall in 957 by Edgar, King of Mercia and Northumbria, he was made Bp. of Worcester and London; after Edgar had become King of all England in 959, Dunstan was made Abp. of Canterbury the same year. The King and the Archbishop together planned and carried out a thorough reform of Church and State.

In 973 Edgar's establishment of firm rule throughout England, and his wider authority in Britain, was marked by his (second) coronation, at Bath by Dunstan. This service forms the basis of all subsequent English Coronations.

After the death of Edgar. Dunstan and his friend St Oswald secured the election of King Edward the Martyr, who continued his predecessor's policy. Edward, however, ruled for only a short time. and under his successor Dunstan's influence began to decrease.

The restoration of regular monastic life, which seems to have been virtually extinct in England by the middle of the 10th cent., was in the first instance Dunstan's work; but as it got under way in Edgar's reign (959–75) much of the initiative passed to his colleagues St Ethelwold and St Oswald.

He zealously supported the cause of learning and himself achieved fame as musician, illuminator, and metalworker.

In the political field his most important work was his support of King Edgar.
