

ANGLICAN DIOCESE OF WANGARATTA Parochial District of Wangaratta West & The Warbys Tenth Sunday after Pentecost—{OS 18} 6th august 2023

A vey warm welcome this morning to Fr Alan Jarrad, we are very pleased that he is available to lead us in our worship this morning. And of course, the **lovely Jayne** will be playing for us.

Next week we will welcome the Revd Maureen Beattie to our services.

John Henry Newman (1801-1890), the 19th-century's most important English-speaking Roman Catholic theologian, spent the first half of his life as an Anglican and the second half as a Roman Catholic. He was a priest, popular preacher, writer, and eminent theologian in both churches.

Born in London, England, he studied at Oxford's Trinity College, was later ordained a priest in the Anglican Church and served at Oxford's university church.

After 1833, Newman was a prominent member of the Oxford Movement of the Anglican Church, which emphasized the Church's debt to the Church Fathers and challenged any tendency to consider truth as completely subjective.

Historical research made Newman suspect that the Roman Catholic Church was in closest continuity with the Church that Jesus established. In 1845, he was received into full communion as a Catholic. Two years later he was ordained a Catholic priest in Rome and returned to England.

Newman eventually wrote 40 books and 21,000 letters that survive. When Newman was named a cardinal in 1879, he took as his motto *"Cor ad cor loquitur"*—"Heart speaks to heart."

John Henry Newman has been called the "absent Father of Vatican II" because his writings on conscience, religious liberty, Scripture, the vocation of lay people, the relation of Church and State, and other topics were extremely influential in the shaping of the Council's documents. Although Newman was not always understood or appreciated, he steadfastly preached the Good News by word and example.

In 2010, Pope Benedict XVI beatified Newman in London. Benedict noted Newman's emphasis on the vital place of revealed religion in civilized society, but also praised his pastoral zeal for the sick, the poor, the bereaved, and those in prison. Pope Francis canonized Newman in October 2019. Saint John Henry Newman's liturgical feast is October 9.

Mary Sumner Miller - Mothers Union - Founded in 1876 by a Hampshire vicar's wife, Mary Sumner, and launched as a national organisation at the 1885 Church Congress, the Mothers' Union (MU) had 500,000 members by 1939.

The Mothers' Union is *an international Christian charity that seeks to support families worldwide*. Its members are not all mothers or even all women.
