This Thursday, 16th November is one of my favourite Saints, Margaret of Scotland. I will give more details below but here I will recount that when Sue and I were on our epic LSL Holiday of 2012 one of the highlights was to be in the tiny St Margaret's Chapel in the forecourt of Edinburgh Castle and be allowed to sit quietly for a few moments to pray. Although the day was bleak and wet, there so many people everywhere and so to be find ourselves in the chapel when there was only the official guide there was precious especially when after we briefly related how we met at St Margaret's church Mildura and our son was named Callum (Columba) the guide said you take the opportunity to take it all in while it's quiet. We were so grateful to be able to ponder and pray in those few moments. A lasting, lovely memory. The photo of the stained glass window of St Margaret is the one I took that day.

Margaret of Scotland, St (c. 1046–93), wife of Malcolm III of Scotland, and granddaughter of the English king, Edmund Ironside. She was probably born in Hungary. In 1067, after the battle of Hastings, she left England with her mother and sister and found refuge at the court of Malcolm, to whom she was married in 1070, despite a leaning to the religious life. At her instigation many abuses were reformed, and synods held to regulate the Lenten fast and Easter Communion and the observance of the prohibited degrees in marriage. Her great personal piety found expression in her practice of prayer and fasting, in her charity to the poor, and in the royal benefactions to religion in her lifetime, which included the foundation of the Church of the Holy Trinity at Dunfermline. She died on 16 November 1093 four days after her husband.

Margaret and Malcolm restored the ruined abbey on Iona and founded several churches, including Dunfermline Abbey in 1072, built as a setting for Margaret's greatest treasure, a relic of the true Cross. Her jewel-encrusted Gospel book (which according to legend was miraculously recovered from a river into which it had fallen) is now in the Bodleian Library at Oxford.
