Shrove Tuesday, the day immediately preceding Ash Wednesday (the beginning of Lent in Western churches). Shrove Tuesday is the English name for the day before Ash Wednesday, in French it is called *Mardi gras* and in German *fetter Dienstag*. Shrove, derived from shrive, refers to the confession of sins as a preparation for Lent, a usual practice in Europe in the Middle Ages. On Shrove Tuesday, it was once the custom for many Christians to make a special point of self-examination, of considering what wrongs they need to repent, and what amendments of life or areas of spiritual growth they especially need to ask God's help in dealing with. Often they would consult on these matters with a spiritual counsellor, or receive shrift.

We can see how this custom has fallen into disuse and these days the other aspects of the day are all that is 'celebrated' so to speak.

Shrove Tuesday is also called Fat Tuesday because on that day a thrifty housewife uses up the fats that she has kept around (the can of bacon drippings, or whatever) for cooking, but that will not be used during Lent. Since pancakes are a standard way of using up fat, the day is also called Pancake Tuesday. In England, and perhaps elsewhere, the day is celebrated with pancake races. The contestants run a course while holding a griddle and flipping a pancake. Points are awarded for time, for number and height of flips, and number of times the pancake turns over. There are of course penalties for dropping the pancake. Similarly rich pre-Lenten treats, sweet packi are traditional in Poland, and king cake is an iconic part of Mardi Gras ("Fat Tuesday") in New Orleans.

So much as Hot Cross Buns are no longer confined to their original use, so these days we find people going to much trouble to get together the ingredients for pancakes, rather than pancakes being a way of using up what is in the pantry. Any excuse for a party I guess!

Ash Wednesday

The first day of Lent is marked with a special liturgy. The theme for the day, though not for all of Lent, is that we stand as sinners condemned to die, but for God's grace. This is symbolized by the imposition of ashes on the forehead, with the words, "You are dust and to dust you shall return." In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of penitence (feeling regretful at offences) and mourning.

Ash Wednesday is one of two days of special observance (the other being Good Friday) for which fasting is recommended. While this usually refers going without food for the entire day, this practice is not practical for all persons, including, but not limited to, diabetics. Use your own discretion in determining how you can best observe this day.
