Dear Parishioners, today is often called *Low Sunday*. It is probably so called in contrast to the 'high' feast of Easter Sunday itself. In Latin it used to be termed *Dominica in albis*, which is an abbreviation of '*Dominica in albis deponendis*' or '*depositis*'. On this day those who were newly baptized at Easter put aside their white robes.

Of course for the world, Easter is now over with for another year, easter eggs are at least half price in the shops which still have stock and the next holiday is being planned for.

For the Christian though, Easter Season has only just begun. I've learnt over time that it is almost impossible to maintain anything like the joy of the celebration of Easter Day for more than a few days, ordinary life quickly pushes aside the exhilaration of the "Queen of Festivals". However for our soul's sake it is imperative that we now walk the weeks of Easter Season with as much attention (or maybe more) as we did the weeks of Lent.
