Bishop Clarence writes to the Holy Trinity and Wangaratta West & Warbys parishes this week. . .

Dear Parishioners

It is with great excitement that we welcome The Rt. Rev'd Donald Kirk to Holy Trinity Cathedral this morning. Bishop Donald is the Bishop of Riverina and was part of a ministry activity for our Diocese yesterday and I am very grateful to him for agreeing to be here today.

Good news is that Bishop Donald will return on 31 August, as the preacher for the Installation and Induction of The Venerable Neil Hicks as Vicar and Dean of Holy Trinity Cathedral.

Last week I mentioned the intention of meeting with the Parish Wardens of both Wangaratta West & Holy Trinity Cathedral to look at service times and how with minimal changes, we might be able to ensure that St Michael's and the Cathedral will have a Eucharist every Sunday and mostly serviced by the Dean-designate. Unfortunately, I developed Plantar Fasciitis and was not able to have those discussions. I hope that we will be able to do so next week so that we can make recommendations soon for what will possibly be implemented with effect 1st October.

As mentioned before, to have a smooth and effective cooperative ministry, there need to be adjustments to allow the Priest who takes on all the extra responsibility, to be able to give the best service to all but also ensuring self-care in the process which has been a key element of discussion leading to this proposed ministry structure.

Statistically speaking in relation to the attendance at the Cathedral over two services on Sunday, we need to engage in a ministry plan of action that will facilitate growth and I hope that this proposed ministry structure with the help of our Diocesan Ministry Action Planning Team, we will be able to see some kind of change that is necessary for a Cathedral Church within a Diocese. Our neighbours and fellow cooperative Anglican Church in Wang West have a strong Sunday attendance and it is hoped that our relationship will develop into something where we will be able to worship together from time to time, pray together and collaborate on some activities.

We are also seeking further ways of strengthening our ministry here at the Cathedral with other initiatives under development.
