

GATHERING IN GOD'S NAME

The Acclamation, Introduction and Greeting

Bless the Lord who forgives all our sins, whose mercy endures for ever.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.

And also with you.

The Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling Holy Water

Let us pray, dear friends, that the Lord our God may bless this gift of water, which will be sprinkled upon us to remind us of our baptism.

May God help us to remain faithful to the Holy Spirit we have received.

After a brief period of silence, the priest says the following prayer.

All-powerful and ever-living God, your gift of water brings life and freshness to the earth; by water we are cleansed from sin and receive the gift of eternal life.

On this day which you have made your own we ask you, Lord, to bless this water: may it be our safeguard and protection.

Renew in us the living fountain of your grace and defend us, soul and body, from evil, that we may approach you with pure hearts and worthily receive your gift of salvation.

We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

As the priest moves through the church to sprinkle the people with water, all sing

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from the Book Joshua [5. 9-12

After the Israelites had crossed over the Jordan river, The LORD said to Joshua,

'Today I have rolled away from you the disgrace of Egypt.' And so that place is called Gilgal to this day.

While the Israelites were camped in Gilgal they kept the Passover in the evening on the fourteenth day of the month in the plains of Jericho. On the day after the passover, on that very day, they ate the produce of the land, unleavened cakes and parched grain.

A reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians [5. 16-21]

From now on, we regard no one from a human point of view; even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way.

So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

The Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke [15. 1-3, 11b-32] **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

All the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to Jesus. And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, 'This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them.'

So he told them this parable:

'There was a man who had two sons. The younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of the property that will belong to me." So he divided his property between them.

A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and travelled to a distant country, and there he squandered his property in dissolute living. When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that country, and he began to be in need.

So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. He would gladly have filled himself with the pods that the pigs were eating; and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself he said, "How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." So he set off and went to his father.

But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. Then the son said to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son." But the father said to his slaves, "Quickly, bring out a robe – the best one – and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate; for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!" And they began to celebrate.

Now his elder son was in the field; and when he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. He replied, "Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf, because he has got him back safe and sound." Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. But he answered his father, "Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command; yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!" Then the father said to him, "Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this

brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found."

For the Gospel of the Lord, praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.

The Sermon

The Creed is said, all standing.

Let us together affirm the faith of the Church:

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.
