Dear Parishioners,

Amidst the deliberations, intentions and commitment of the Lenten season, and the sacredness, sombreness and celebrations of Holy Week and Easter Day, it is easy to overlook one of the most significant teachings of Jesus that occurred on the night before He died.

During the Last Supper, as His friends were wondering what was going to happen, John's gospel records that Jesus said to them: – A new command I give you: Love one another, as I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another. (*John 13:34-35*)

"Love one another". Why was this a "new" commandment?

- 1. Jesus and His disciples were from the Jewish religion and there were a lot of laws and rules to follow. Along with the 10 commandments Love God, love others, don't steal or murder, don't try to have everything that other people have, there were rules about how to manage your household, how to prepare for special religious events, what you could eat, etc. But Jesus was telling them. don't make the 'rules' more important than actually loving God and caring about other people.
- 2. Jesus' command was to love one another in a new way those beyond their immediate circle. It was to love *everyone*, including people from different cultures, religions, and even their enemies,—loving others even when it's hard. He was showing them that love means helping, forgiving, and caring for others, just like He had done throughout His life, and was about to do in the ultimate gift of love, by dying on the cross.
- 3. Jesus outlined a new commandment that broadened the picture for His disciples—a call to be people who would love and care for each other like a family, and in this way, draw others to God. Jesus said, "When you love each other, people will see that you are my followers." These followers were to become the Christian church people choosing to be on Jesus' special team!

This is what we too are called to do – especially in this Season of HOPE 25, as we live out Jesus' 'new commandment' in the communities in which we live, we pray that people will be drawn to be part of God's family and Jesus' team. May God bless and guide each of you, and your families throughout this Eastertide.
