The Clergy of our Diocese had 3 wonderful days (give or take a few hours) at Bright Chalet at our annual professional development days. Our guest speaker this year was Bishop Kevin Nichols of the Diocese of Bethlehem Pennsylvania USA. Bp Kevin led us in reflections on The Psalms, using the work of the theologian Walter Brueggemann in seeing psalms as being one of 3 types: Psalms of Orientation; Psalms of Disorientation; Psalms of New Orientation.

The culmination of Kevin's teaching was for each of us to write our own Psalm. This turned out to be a most amazing experience for pretty much all of us. When Kevin had mentioned at the outset that this was the goal, I didn't think I would be able to do it and like many others was surprised when I discovered that I could and did do this very thing.

And the collegiality was superb and the weather was unseasonably gentle (and because of that the autumn display this year is a bit lack lustre) and as always we were very well cared for by the people at Bright Chalet.

As advised last Sunday, today **May 4th**, is **DV Sunday** in the Anglican Church of Australia. This is an initiative of the Anglican Church's Families and Culture Commission and is a call to us to shine a light on domestic and family violence. You are also being invited to make a donation so that the Church can continue to serve well those who are impacted by it in our churches.



We affirm that Domestic Violence has no place in the
