25th May 2025 The Sixth Sunday of Easter

The Seasons of the Church Calendar can be instrumental in strengthening and encouraging us in the ebb and flow of our own Christian lives. The Season of Easter has much to offer us, as a space to continue to reflect and celebrate the resurrection of Jesus, and at the same time, consider how our lives individually and the life of the church can respond and grow.

The Season from Easter Day through the Day of Pentecost, is the oldest part of the Church Year. It is derived from the fifty-day period in the Jewish calendar, which began with Passover and concluded with Pentecost (the Greek term for "fiftieth day"). The Lord's death and resurrection took place at Passover, and its completion—the empowering of the apostles by the Holy Spirit—took place on Pentecost. The feast days were moved to Sundays due to the intense reverence for the first day of the week as the Lord's Day, the Day of Resurrection.

The Great Fifty Days contain a number of differing liturgical characteristics:

Alleluia

This word, (Hebrew 'hallelujah') means literally, "praise to Yahweh." In Jewish worship, it is particularly characteristic of Passover, when the 'Hallel' Psalms (Psalms 113-118) are sung.

These Hallel Psalms have maintained their importance in the Christian Passover—that is, Easter. Psalm 114 is sung at the Easter Vigil and Psalm 118 on Easter Day. The word 'Hallelujah' has an important place in the church's worship, as we see in the book of Revelation, and the descriptions of worship in heaven in that book. During Eastertide, along with its regular use, the word 'alleluia' is also in many hymns and other parts of the liturgy.

The Paschal Candle

The paschal candle (from the Latin/Greek word pascha, meaning "Passover"), often decorated with nails representing the wounds from the crucifixion which the risen Lord's body still bore, first lighted at the Great Vigil on Easter Eve, is lit at every service during the season. As early as the 4th CE, the celebration of the Resurrection in Jerusalem began with a candle being brought out and lighted in the Holy Sepulchre on Easter Eve to the words, "The light of Christ." That ceremony continues today.

The Acts of the Apostles

Rather than an Old Testament reading, throughout Eastertide, the Acts of the Apostles furnishes one of the readings every Sunday during the Great Fifty Days. This book with its description of the development and life of early Christian community, characterized by an intense awareness of the risen Lord's presence and the apostolic preaching of the Resurrection, has much to offer us as the church continues to grow and change today.
